With a long history of insulin dependent diabetes, JG was first referred to the Barnabas medical program by the hospital emergency department staff after multiple admissions for uncontrolled blood sugar issues. He had many barriers that impeded his progress to better health, including access to healthy food, transportation, diabetic supplies, and consistent and affordable medical care. In addition to receiving the professional medical attention he needed, JG was also supported by other Barnabas programs and services. He began using the Lyft Health ride program to get to his weekly medical appointments; received insulin at no cost through the Prescription Assistance Program; and was enrolled in Barnabas' Rx for Healthy Living Program that provided him nutritious food. JG's recent blood sugar tests showed a remarkable improvement, and he is choosing and eating healthier foods. He is thankful for the extraordinary support that helped save his

The day Karen and Robert spotted a Barnabas ad in a local newspaper, their lives changed. They were disabled, unemployed and living in poverty, uninsured and facing extremely serious medical and mobility problems. After they met with Barnabas' resource coordinator, they were connected to comprehensive support services offered by Barnabas, including dental and medical care, vision screening, and the Barnabas food pantry. Robert has come to even enjoy going to the dentist because he knows he will receive exceptionally compassionate care. Likewise, Karen is thankful for the women's health exam she received since she had not had this type of care in many years. They both appreciate the respect they feel every time they are at Barnabas and are thankful the community has this much-needed resource.




