Cindy* came to the Barnabas Center when she needed help providing for the holidays. An expectant single mother of four, Cindy says she has always experienced joy from giving. "I work so hard to help my children understand that giving to others is more important than receiving," she said. "I've even asked them to consider giving some of their own toys away to children who don't have any toys." This year, however, Cindy found herself on the receiving end. She was part of Barnabas' Adopt-A-Family program. "We never thought this would be us," she said. "I never thought I'd have to ask for help. Barnabas was a blessing during this time and helped me when I needed support to provide for my children." Cindy says she is grateful for the donors who make Barnabas' programs possible. Through their support, families like hers get that extra help when they need it most.

Tommy* decided he wanted to make a difference outside of his time in the classroom. He found an opportunity through his father's work volunteering at one of Barnabas' mobile food distributions. His job was to pack food into bags to be distributed to families. When a fellow volunteer, Shelly, suggested that he pick up the pace because there were so many cars in line, Tommy couldn't believe his eyes. "It's impossibly possible that we are going to give enough food to feed all of these people today," he said. The other volunteers chuckled and continued their work packing food bags; and together, the impossible became possible. Tommy and his father continue volunteering at Barnabas and donating vegetables every month at the mobile food distributions. Barnabas volunteers like to model their work on the Amelia Earhart quote, "A single act of kindness throws out roots in all directions, and the roots spring up and make new trees."


